





We had a total of 35 brothers who participated and 1 alumni brother. We spent a total of approximately 100 brother hours on this event. I randomized the teams to split the different class into



month. In addition, BRODYs send pictures or videos of their time spent together to the




event chairs.

# Brothers Doing Good Because it is a Pleasure

In addition to contributing community service hours to PDC, brothers are active in other community service based organizations on campus. The A Life of Healing and

Awareness (ALOHA) Project serves the Hilo community by providing extensive screening and counseling with opportunity for follow-up. Screenings include



A1c, cholesterol, blood pressure, and BMI. Patients can choose which screenings they would like to receive and their session is concluded with results, brief nutrition counseling and recommendations for follow-up with their PCP. In the 2014-2015 academic year, 38 brothers have contributed over 300 hours of community service with the ALOHA Project. Brothers are also extensively involved in community service efforts with APhA. This yea, APhA has four

operations that focus on community service: Operation Diabetes, Operation Heart, Operation Immunization, and Generation Rx.All 8 co-chair positions for these operations are filled by Gamma Theta brothers. Brothers have contributed to these efforts by giving 114 vaccines, over 100 A1c tests, and recording nearly 200 blood pressures, yielding over 600 community service hours. These two organizations, ALOHA Project and APhA, are the predominant organizations on campus that give back to the Hilo community in addition to Phi Delta Chi. Brothers of Gamma Theta have proven their dedication to the community,

contributing selflessly and genuinely, and doing so because community service is a keystone of not only Phi Delta Chi, but also the profession of pharmacy.

# Miloli'i Health Fair



The 5th annual Miloli`i health screening event was held in February of 2015. We provided health screenings and education to the residents of Miloli`i. Health screenings provided by brothers included HbA1C, cholesterol and blood glucose screenings. In addition

to this, brothers provided education for residents on

various disease states such as diabetes, hypertension and dyslipidemia.

Having spent approximately 3 months of planning and 200 brother hours, we were able to collaborate with a local health center to provide screenings to 15 members of the Miloli`i community as well as educate and build relationships with during our four hour stay. A local community health clinic physician's assistant provided one-on-one patient counseling. This is the first time that Gamma Theta brothers were able to collaborate with this specific community health center. The access to

health care and health resources in the Miloli`i area is very limited; working with local community health care professionals who are not affiliated with Phi Delta Chi afforded us the opportunity to help build relationships between residents of the community and said health care providers. In doing so, we were able to allow residents to familiarize themselves with health care providers with whom they can connect with on a regular basis given the isolated nature of their community. Each member of the community was given

adequate time for the provider from the health center to get to know each of those served on a more intimate level. This provides a better foundation for following years.


