





Community Service Mission Statement

This year through the hard work and aspiration of our brothers, Phi Delta Chi Gamma Theta ensured these goals were met through participation in numerous community activities. Our long term goal is to make a positive difference in the community and providing quality services to our patients, thereby advancing public health and strengthening ourselves as health care professionals.



The Community Service Committee



Brothers from the Gamma Theta Chapter along with students and faculty conducted blood pressure, cholesterol and diabetes screenings. Along with the screenings, there was a "brown bag" medication check for community members to bring all their current medications and be counseled on each one to ensure proper administration and compliance. There were also

healthy living demonstrations with instructors who taught various exercise techniques

and routines. Informational booths were set up all around the fair to share information about healthy living lifestyles. This included smoking cessation, healthy diets, sexual health, cancer and many more. The younger family members were not forgotten. There was a healthy living art competition for local school children and a children's compounding booth. Other community organizations





were invited to conduct concurrent activities at the fair as well. This included the Hawai 'i Bone Marrow Donor Registry, NED Drug Take Back Program, Hawai 'i Cataract and Laser Institution, Hawai 'i Island HIV/ AIDS Foundation, Senior Medicare Patrol, and Akaka Falls Lions Club.



Leimomi Shearer, the cancer program manager for Hui Malama Ola Na 'Oiwi', a program that offers free clinical breast exams with referrals for mammography exams for uninsured and underinsured men and women stated "Native Hawaiian women have the highest mortality rate for breast and lung cancer. As women, we take care of everybody and sometimes we forget to take care of ourselves. The message is, take care of ourselves, so we can make sure to be there to take care of loved ones." With this alarming fact in mind, Phi Delta Chi wanted to raise awareness and celebrate the lives of breast cancer survivors through 'E Ola Kakou. The Hui

Malama Ola Na 'Oiwi, E' Ola Kakou celebrated breast cancer survivors and their o'hana in a fun filled, educational event with activities for all members of the family. While the event looked to honor the past breast cancer survivors, one of its main priorities was the future. Many of the


booths at Hui Malama were set up with the goal of increasing the awareness in the local community about breast cancer. University of Hawai'i at Hilo College of Pharmacy faculty, Dr. Forrest Batz, asked Gamma Theta chapter to create an interactive booth with models and information boards to contribute to the event. The Gamma Theta chapter's booth featured informational poster boards that presented recent data and various facts on breast cancer. Along with the poster boards were interactive quizzes that helped gauge the community's current knowledge on breast cancer and a step by step guide to self-breast exams. Also on display was Brother Lindsey Takara's "Candy Lumps," which are hand-packaged breast cancer candy demonstration bags with assorted candy.



Each candy was carefully selected for size that was respectively the same size as average breast lumps typically found depending on different detection methods and frequency of examination. The candy bags allowed for an interactive demonstration of lump sizes and assisted in educating people on the importance of early detection. The booth was able to reach out to over 75 people in the community that came out to the event.

UHH MEN'S SOCCER BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

This October Phi Delta Chi Gamma Theta teamed up with UH Hilo's Men's Soccer to help raise money for breast cancer prevention and provide the community with education about prevention and treatment. The men's team wore pink soccer jerseys during the game and raffled the jerseys off during and after the game. All proceeds from the jerseys were donated to the cause. Brothers Janine Masri and Katie Bass attended the event to represent Gamma Theta and provided education to the fans at the game and helped raffle the jerseys for the men's team.



New Hope, a local church in Hilo, hosts a food pantry each month where they hand out grocery bags filled with nutritious food to families in need such as; low income households,



the working poor, the disabled, the ill, senior citizens, and children throughout the island of Hawai'i. Brothers helped in the morning by packing grocery bags based on household size and then distributed them. Brothers also assisted in other various duties as needed to maintain organization at the event. The brothers of Phi Delta Chi Gamma Theta have made this a monthly event with each month bringing different brothers to

KALANIANAOLE SCHOOL CAREER DAY 11.1.2012

Kalanianaole School Career Day was a career day presentation for the sixth, seventh, and eighth graders at Kalanianaole Intermediate School. Brothers went to inform them of the ins and outs of pharmacy, what a pharmacist does, what kinds of pharmacists there are and

what schooling is required to get into pharmacy school. There were a total of three presentations given each to a group of 10-15 students including their teachers. This was an interactive presentation using Prezzi where each type of pharmacy was discussed using real world pictures and props such as compounding pharmacy, which we brought hand-made capsules, lollipops, suppositories, etc. Students were encouraged to actively participate and were asked questions about what was presented and given candy for participation. Volunteers also spent 10-15 minutes answering any questions after the presentation.





Coloring &

Every holiday the Samaritan's Purse organization sponsors the Operation Christmas Child Event. The event provides people with the opportunity to create and send a box of gifts to a needy child for Christmas. A participant takes a shoebox and fills it with various school, fun and practical gifts and a photograph, letter and/or return address for a child. That way, the child can know who their special package came from and how to thank them if they wish. The participant gets to select whether the package is for a boy or a girl and what age group it

is for. Once dropped off at specified locations, the packages could be sent out to anywhere in the world or even back in the home state of Hawai'i. Gamma Theta chapter worked with Big Island Toyota to make these deliveries possible. They generously provided us 33 plastic boxes to be filled and packaged. And they also covered the

\$7 per box. Pledges were also allowed to participate in this event with the actives. They had to make the extra effort and provide their own shoebox along with the \$7 shipping donation. Many of them worked in groups to create the packages and share in the shipping costs.

Altogether, with the contributions of the actives and pledges, there were over 50 packages dropped off and shipped out to needy children around the world.

Funded by the HI BEACON, the Get Fit Program was a 10-week healthy lifestyle challenge. It encourages participants to gather their friends, co-workers and family to form teams of 4 to 10 people, then take the challenge to make effective, positive lifestyle changes. Program elements include: access to fitness classes, activities and team prizes, personalized goals, resources like food, recipes and activity trackers, and free health screenings by RNs and student pharmacists. Pharmacy and nursing students worked under the guidance of faculty to perform blood pressure and BMI screenings as well as counseling of patients on ways to improve their overall health. Over the course of two and half months, patients were expected to follow counseling advice based on personal goals they set to improve their health. Many pharmacy students were able to pick a patient to follow. At follow-up events, patients came back and were reassessed to see

how much their weight, BMI, blood pressure, and overall health and happiness has improved.



WINDOW DISPLAY

This is a community service project that also serves as a competition between all of the chapters of PDC nationwide. The window display is a window dressing or poster intended to raise awareness on the importance of the role of pharmacy in the delivery of health care through addressing a specific health-related topic. Placement in a high-traffic location, multiple locations, and a unique theme greatly increased our desired outcome of raising awareness. This year Gamma Theta made two poster boards educating the public about the safety of using over the counter pain relievers and natural supplements, especially noni juice. Noni juice is a popular natural supplement that a large part of the community uses for pain and inflammation. Gamma Theta felt that these products are commonly used in our community and are thought of as "harmless." The posters informed people of these product's possible interactions and overdoses. Brothers also promoted the accessibility of

the pharmacist to assist in making decisions about over the counter pain reliever and natural supplements. To target the rural population we decided to present our project at three of our local farmer's markets, Hilo, Keaau, and Pahoa. Brothers of Gamma Theta attended these farmers markets every week for three months reaching over 1000 residents.








ST. JUDE'S

St Jude's sends us the materials needed so brothers can send letters to their family and friends to inquire for donations towards St Jude's. This was intended to show our dedication to St Jude's and inspire the receivers of the letters to donate. All together the brothers of Gamma Theta were able to send out one hundred letters in support of St. Jude's Children's Hospital.

A common phrase here in Hawai'i is "Respect the Aina, Live Pono," which means "Respect your land/home, live with honesty." We combed the ocean front with trash bags and collected any garbage found along the shores. We filled several bags with trash and even found a car tire and a vibrating chair.

promotes philanthropy for them as much as possible.








FACULTY APPRECIATION BREAKFAST

Miloli'i is identified as being the last fishing villiage in Hawai'i, with a population of approximately 200 people. Miloli'i is challenged with a lack of electricity, running water, fresh fruits and vegetables, and access to quality healthcare.

The annual health fair continues to expand to include more screenings, health education, and an expanded keiki (kids) camp that includes a keiki passport similar to that that the adults used in the previous health fairs. The Daniel K. Inouye College of Pharmacy and the Phi Dex Miloli'i Health Fair continues to collaborate with Big Island community organizations. This year the Hawai'i island HIV/AIDS foundation provided free HIV and Hepatitis C screenings. The Hui Mālama Ola Nā 'Ōiwi (group to take care of life and body) facilitates smoking cessation

certification for students

EDUCATION BOOTHS



Education booths at this years health fair include Cardiovascular Disease and Hypertension education, Diabetes education, Asthma education, Smoking Cessation, Nutrition, Women's Health, HIV/STD's education, Active Living, and Kidney Health. These education booths have been adapted to specifically address the health needs the Miloli'i community. Participants at the health fair received a Health Fair Passport which was designed as a guide to the menu of services offered at the fair. These passports included space for participants to offer feedback or request for future services. This form has be subsequently implemented in the Daniel K. Inouye College of Pharmacy Health Fairs, as well as other local events.



SCREENINGS



Health screening provided by the college of pharmacy included hypertension blood pressure screens, hyperlipidemia cholesterol screens, diabetic Hemoglobin AIc screens, height/weight/BMI, diabetic foot care, and a "brown bag" medication counseling with the pharmacists. For some residents this was their first year getting screened and for others this was their third year for health screenings. As the years continue and the research data is compiled, it is our hopes that we will see marked health improvement in this community which lacks easily accessible access to health care providers.

WHAT HAS BEEN SAID ABOUT MILOLI'I

"We are very fortunate to practice in Hawai'i where we can work together to better the health of Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders (NHPI). However just in my few years here working at Bay Clinic and volunteering at health fairs for local communities, I have seen huge health disparities for NHPI populations. These health disparities are multi-dimensional -- poverty, lower education levels, geographical remoteness, language barriers and overall differences in mentality regarding provision and culture of medical care presents a huge challenge to providing quality care. It will take a concerted and long-term effort by the local medical community to address these dee-rooted challenges and improve the health of the native populations."












MILOLI'I RESEARCH



Student-directed implementation of a community health fair in a rural setting.

Research poster conclusions: In the rural, 200+ resident community of Miloli'i, 74 adults were screened and educated on long-term healthy lifestyle choices to improve individual and community health outcomes. 25 children participated in fun educational and physical exercise activities. Student pharmacists learned the importance of finding effective ways to encourage adults and children to make healthy lifestyle choices. Students also experienced

how to tailor health services to better meet the unique needs of the community. Goals established for future Miloli'i Health Fairs include documenting patient impact to assess changes in measurable health outcomes, as well as bringing immunizations and medication assistance programs to the community.

This poster has been presented at two conferences, the ALEX Student Research Conference at UH Hilo, and the HPhA Annual Meeting on Oahu. Brothers Jack Goldsberry and Janine Masri were each awarded funding through the UH Hilo Student Ambassador Program, to assist their efforts in sharing student-led research with the community.

The Office of Applied Learning Experiences (ALEX) hosted its first annual student research conference at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo, on Saturday, February 9th, 2013. The purpose of the conference was to showcase student research, and encourage faculty to incorporate this into their own courses. Brothers Jack and Janine presented their findings and talked to UH Hilo faculty members about the process of implementing and improving student-directed research.

The Hawai'i Pharmacist's Association (HPhA) hosted its 2nd annual poster session at its HPhA meeting in Oahu, on April 13th and 14th, 2013. This association is dedicated to improving the health of the people of Hawai'i, by advancing the practice of pharmacy and improving quality of care through the healthcare team. Brothers Jack and Janine spoke with several Hawai'i pharmacists about healthcare challenges the people of Miloli'i face. They discussed data gathered from the residents, such as health markers, disease prevalence, and medication use. The abstract from their presented research will be published in the Hawai'i Medical Journal.

Plans are in the works for Gamma Theta to continue research during their 4th Annual Miloli'i Heath Fair in 2014, so that the impact on the community can continue to be documented. One of our primary service goals has been to bring healthcare to the people of Hawai'i. It has been rewarding to maintain the unique relationship we have established with the people of Miloli'i, and we look forward to expanding our efforts with other Big Island communities in need.

One of the common goals generated during the officer's retreat was for us to recognize and promote scholastic achievement within the fraternity. 




BROTHERS IN LEADERSHIP



One of the programs that we are implementing this Fall semester is the personal GPA goal program. In this program, each brother is required to set a GPA goal that they will try to attain or surpass this semester. At the end of the semester, brothers will be asked whether or not they reached their GPA goal and will receive a small award if they have met or surpassed their GPA goal. The purpose of the GPA goal program is not only to motivate brothers to strive for better grades but to also raise awareness of the benefits of setting goals.

GUEST SPEAKERS



We had the amazing opportunity to have Dr. Luolo Hong the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs come speak to our chapter about leadership. Dr. Hong is a member of the Chancellor's senior leadership team and she is responsible for providing vision, leadership, direction, and accountability for non-instructional and co-curricular activities, programs and services that contribute to student development, learning, and success.

Dr. Hong spoke on how to approach and embrace leadership as well as answered questions about leadership. This talk was scheduled

several weeks before our officer elections to encourage and motivate members to run for leadership positions.



On Friday May 3rd, the brothers were fortunate enough to have four of the P4 brothers do an informal presentation and discussion on the residency process. The presentation and host of the discussion was Victor Lin, who will be doing a PGY1 residency at St. Luke's- Roosevelt Hospital Center in New York, NY. Brothers Cassie Kim, Prabu Segaran, and Mike Tsuji were also present via google chat to answer any additional questions and communicate their experience to the

brothers looking forward to residency. Cassis Kim will be working as a first year pharmacy residency at Southern Nevada Healthcare System in North Las Vegas, NV. Prabu Segaran will be doing a PGY1 residency at Providence St Peter in Olympia, WA. Mike Tsuji will complete his residency a PGY1 residency at the Pacific Islands Health Care in Honolulu, HI. Since the school has no formal residency discussion topics, it was very exciting that the Gamma Theta chapter could offer this unique experience to its members. Fifteen brothers participated in the event and were able to get all their residency questions answered. Gamma Theta is extremely proud of all the fourth year brothers that received residency and is looking forward to continuing to have brothers enter this prestigious arena.

THE ANTICANCER PROPERTIES OF FUNGAL ENDOPHYTES of Morinda citrifolia Linn. (NONI)

Abstract: Medicinal plants utilized by various cultures have consistently been examined as sources of lead compounds for drug development. Noni (*Morinda citrifolia* Linn.) is a popular medicinal plant indigenous to many regions of the world including Asia, the Caribbean, and the Pacific Islands. Despite being used traditionally for over 2000 years, the diverse medicinal claims of noni remain largely unverified under rigorous pharmacological criteria. Noni fruit juice is processed and prepared by a variety of methods that may or may not involve the process of fermentation. The use of non-standardized preparations in pre-clinical and clinical

studies has further confounded the body of data available on the true efficacy of this plant remedy of enduring cultural significance. In an attempt to explore the role of endophytic fungi in the anticancer properties of noni, 25 unique entities were isolated from the fruit and leaves of the plant, five of which completely inhibited the growth of human carcinoma cell lines LU-1 (lung), LNCaP (prostate) and MCF-7 (breast) at a concentration of 20 µg/mL. ITS sequencing is being utilized to identify all fungi of interest. Activity-guided chromatographic separation over silica gel coupled with preparative TLC and MPLC led to the positive identification of four compounds. These bioactive constituents may be the product of symbiotic interactions between the fungal endophyte and its host plant. Such cryptic metabolic contributions could conceivably play a role in the purported usefulness of noni in the management of a variety of diseases including cancer.






CAR WASHES






MERRIE MONARCH FUNDRAISER

Every year the Daniel K. Inouye College of Pharmacy honors a student organization that has gone above and beyond to receive the Outstanding Student Organization Award. This year Phi


